
### Culbreth Park, a stark before and after



In mid 2008 the Chapel Hill Town Council asked the Home Trust to oversee substantial renovations to seven homes in the Culbreth Park neighborhood. The homes were built in the early 1990's as part of a Town program to provide affordable homeownership to low income families. Working with Synergy Building Company, our construction manager, Lanny Pratt, managed renovations to these homes that included new roofs, siding, HVAC systems and windows. We recently completed the work about \$40,000 under budget.

Jennifer De La Rosa, a single mom with two daughters, was tired of renting especially after an apartment she lived in flooded, compelling her to move. Jennifer, a secretary with Chapel Hill-Carrboro City Schools, said she was looking for the "stability of ownership" when she found the Home Trust.

Jennifer wanted to continue living in Carrboro, especially since she and her girls, Alondra, 7, and Kailani, 3, are accustomed to biking to school. She wanted a place that she and the girls could make their own. A place where they could paint the walls and plant a garden.

After attending First Time

Homebuyer's classes, Jennifer bought a two bedroom home in the Pacifica Cohousing complex in Carrboro in August.

She recently mulched her front vard and planted a Japanese Maple tree. Alondra and Kailani had their room painted their favorite colors: pink and purple.

Through the Home Trust, Jennifer is able to live in the community in which she works. Without the Home Trust, "I don't think I had any realistic options (for home ownership)," Jennifer said.

16 homes, three of which were new to the Home Trust, increasing our affordable inventory to 137 homes. We partnered with Synergy Building Company to begin construction of two more energy-efficient homes in Carrboro and we managed the renovation of seven homes in Chapel Hill's

Culbreth Park neighborhood. Our Sales team focused on selling 23 condominiums in East 54, which came online in September 2009. Lastly, we changed our name. Orange Community Housing and Land Trust was not user friendly. Community Home Trust better describes our mission: to hold homes in trust for the betterment of our community.

In summary, the 2008-09 fiscal year was the start of a new era here at the Home Trust. Going forward we will provide even greater value to the community through our homeownership program. Ultimately, we view all Home Trust homes as community assets that will serve low income individuals and families today and for decades into the future.
